Layout

The forecabin has a double berth, a hanging locker and shelves.

The Saloon has seating either side with a dining table on the starboardside.

The chart table is to port, aft of this is the large main head which has a marine wc, handbasin and showerhead with hot/cold pressurized fresh water supply.

The 'L' shaped galley is to starboard and has a twin bowl stainless steel sink with hot/cold fresh water supply, a two burner gas stove with oven and grill and a large fridge.

There are two large double berth aft cabins.
